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

The Dr. A.M. (Sandy) Clark Nova Scotia Postal History Collection

Lot 1-194



Dr. Alexander (Sandy) Clark studied medicine at the University of Birmingham, England. He emigrated to Ontario, Canada in 1966 and after a brief period settled in Pubnico, Nova Scotia. He practiced medicine there for 27 years before retiring.

A long time friend, I cannot recall exactly when I first met Sandy. However, I do remember travelling with him in 1996 to attend a major auction of Nova Scotia

postal history. Being a resident of Pubnico, he was determined to buy the rare W.O. Pubnico hand stamp. Successful after much spirited bidding, he announced shortly after that he had paid way too much for it!

Sandy was an enthusiastic and dedicated philatelist. He rarely missed a club meeting even though he had to travel nearly 175 miles to Halifax. At shows, he was usually the first to arrive at my table. Others, arriving later, would enquire "has Sandy been here yet" knowing full well that they had probably missed out on something. I would often tease him about the little black book that he carried around with him, suggesting that business would be a lot better if he left it home. His collecting interests were so varied that he was lost without it, as it contained meticulous notes on dates, type of postmarks, usages and so on. Sandy was always willing to help other collectors, and not only with his time. He would give up a prized cover if he thought that it was more important or better suited to a friend's collection. That is indeed a rare trait in a collector.

Regarded as one of Nova Scotia's most prominent philatelists, Sandy spent many years building one of the finest collections of specialized early (prestamp) Nova Scotia postal history. Formed over several decades, the "Sandy Clark" collection features many exceptional and rare items. I am particularly fond of his ship letter collection, the Liverpool oval crown handstamp being unique. Sandy's collection will be of considerable interest to all collectors. It offers many desirable pieces that have been unavailable to collectors for decades.

Although philately filled a large part of his life, he pursued many other activities. Being very generous with his time, he was a volunteer extraordinaire. In 2002, he was awarded the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal for his service to the community.

I am glad to have known Sandy as a friend; he will be sadly missed.

Halifax 1784 Folded cover from Shelburne with manuscript date "Aug 14 1784" inside addressed to London, rated "1/"; on reverse showing the distinctive and exceptionally rare manuscript "Halifax N.S. 31 Aug" (Type 2) postal marking handwritten in red, according to Macdonald by James Stevens, then Postmaster General of Nova Scotia (1784); two clear "29 / SE" bishopmarks applied on receipt in London. It is remarkable, before this cover offered here and the following lot; it was reported in J.J. Macdonald handbook as being UNIQUE; now the current census is a mere three examples of this very rare "provisional" postmaster manuscript marking, VF Est. 2,000.00+

Here is the census of the three known examples:

- "31 Aug" this the earliest known date, acquired by Sandy in 1997 for his collection.
 "2 Dec" offered in the following lot 5, originally bought in England in 1977 and has since been in Sandy's collection.
- 3. "5 Dec" the third example, originally reported by Macdonald as the UNIQUE example, which once graced the famous collections of deVolpi (1966), Glassco (1969) and Greene (1975).





Mixed condition: in large lots, a range of condition can be expected, from small faults to Very Fine.
