I am extremely pleased indeed to offer the Libra collection of the 1908 Québec Tercentenary. Formed over several decades, it is in our opinion the finest assembly ever put together. The Québecs are a noteworthy issue, for this was the first time that French language inscriptions appeared on Canadian stamps. Popular with collectors from the day it was issued, the designs were carefully chosen and beautifully engraved.

Having a particular fondness for proofs and essays I find this collection a most interesting one, the nucleus of which was acquired in 1990 at auction of the American Bank Note Company Archives. Among the lots purchased was the entire original production file. The models in lot one are some of the most

spectacular items you will ever see, not only for this issue, but for Canadian philately in general. The progressive and trial colour die proofs are undeniably rare and worthy of particular attention. These are rarely seen and take years of hunting to acquire.

Also impressive is the postal history section. Despite the fact that commemorative stamps were discouraged on international mail at the time, you will find a number of lovely covers with exotic destinations. Collectors of high quality mint stamps will not be disappointed, with many nice singles and multiples. The complete set of plate blocks should not be underestimated. Very few exist.

I hope you enjoy this auction catalogue. I am sure that ex. Libra will stand as one of the important benchmarks for this issue.

The Fabulous Lot of the American Bank Note Company Archives Artist Models A breathtaking assembly of the artists' handpainted models and vignettes created for Canada's Second Commemorative Issue. The lot consists of nine different UNIQUE pieces; detailed descriptions are as follows:

Item I

Artist's handpainted die essay of the Half cent in black, brown and Chinese White, with two photographic vignettes affixed over painted design; The King is shown in Civilian dress, which was first approved and then subsequently replaced. Surrounded by various signatures, annotations and handstamps including American Bank Note Order Dept. AUG 24 1908 "clock" on reverse.

Item II

Half cent Die proof (stamp size) affixed on thick card with protective page overleaf; King's original portrait in Civilian dress has been excised by the artist and replaced with a sepia photographic image showing the King in Military Uniform.

Item III

Artist's handpainted triptych composite die, comprising One cent, Two cent and Five cent values, each with handpainted surroundings in their preliminary (and later accepted) colours, all with touched up value tablets, scrolls, top and lower inscriptions in Chinese White and affixed to thick individual cards; all with central vignettes being a photographic reproduction of a design with changes done in a mixture of paint and watercolour. Each with artist and designer signatures below designs, affixed on large card, annotated "Engrave Dies & send to Ottawa" above, datestamped at lower right; on reverse with two different ABNC clock datestamps.

Item IV

Artist's handpainted composite die, prepared in similar fashion to Item III and including the Seven cent and Ten cent values, handpainted surrounding frames. Seven cent without central vignettes and Ten cent with shaped photographic reproduction of the selected Quebec scene affixed in place and enhanced with watercolour. Various signatures, initials by designer and other ABNC employees, plus several datestamps on front and on reverse.

Item V

Artist handpainted individual model of the die for the Fifteen cent denomination, painted surrounding frame in shades of orange; with shaped photographic reproduction of the chosen scene of Champlain's Departure affixed in place and enhanced with watercolour. Various ANBC employee and artist signatures and datestamps, plus a couple of the latter on reverse.

Item VI

Artist handpainted individual model of the die for the Twenty cent denomination, painted by hand of surrounding frame in shades of brown, additional finishing touches to value tablets, scrolls, and inscriptions in Chinese White, directly on thick card; with shaped photographic reproduction of the chosen scene of Cartier's Arrival affixed in its place and enhanced with watercolour. Three different American Bank Note Company employee and artist signatures around painted model and datestamped "ENTERED MAY 14 1908" at lower right corner.

Item VII

Black & white individual photographs of Queen Alexandra and King Edward VII used for the vignettes of the Two cent value, affixed on thick grey card, pencil notation "F1553 - May 12.08 / Finished June 19/08 / Eng by Loizeaux / A.B.N.Co Ottawa" on reverse.

Item VIII

Central vignette model for the Ten cent denomination measuring about 180mm by 100mm, touched up with watercolour and penciled bilingual notation at foot "QUEBEC IN 1700 / QUEBEC EN 1700" and "FROM AN OLD PRINT IN SULTE'S / HISTOIRE DES CANADIENS FRANCAIS", affixed on large card with additional annotation "used on 10c stamp. Die No. F195 / A.B.N. Co Ottawa" at top and pen signed by stamp designer "4/29/08 Jam" (Juan Antonio Machado); with two different datestamps on reverse.

Item IX

Central vignette model similar in size and detail to the previous item but for the Fifteen cent denomination, touched up with watercolour and penciled notation at foot "CHAMPLAIN SETTING OUT ON INLAND DISCOVERIES.", affixed on large card with additional annotation "used on 15c stamp." And "F1553", and pen signed by stamp designer "4/29/08 Jam" (Juan Antonio Machado), two different datestamps on reverse.

A MESMERIZING LOT THAT HAS NEVER BEEN EXHIBITED AND WHICH IS, BY FAR, THE HIGHLIGHT OF THIS IMPRESSIVE COLLECTION. THIS MATERIAL HAS NOT BEEN OFFERED SINCE 1990 WHEN IT FIRST APPEARED IN THE FAMOUS AUCTION OF THE AMERICAN BANK NOTE COMPANY ARCHIVES. A WONDERFUL OPPORTUNITY TO ACQUIRE THE MOST IMPORTANT ITEMS RELATED TO THE 1908 QUEBEC TERCENTENARY ISSUE.








Illustrated History of the Tercentenary Through Postcards, Vignettes, Etc. A fascinating collection of items related to the celebration of the 1908 Quebec Tercentenary, ideal for enhancing a serious collection of this issue. Includes collateral pieces, postcards, drawings, engravings, etc. We note a rare 19 page illustrated history with many scenes, some of these were taken for the issued stamps; noted original "Pageants" program in French and original public program in English, a multipage souvenir book with numerous illustrations; a nice range of 23 mostly different commemorative picture postcards and an additional 22 gold-border official postcards inscribed in French and in English. We also note a very attractive grouping of engraved vignettes of Wolfe, Montcalm, Cartier, Champlain, etc. A seldom seen selection of material worth careful viewing.





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

Note: To get a more accurate idea of the rarity of black die proofs we perused many past "name sale" auction catalogues featuring substantial collections of the Tercentenary Issue, such as Rosemary Nickle (1988), Sir Gawaine Baillie (2006) and Herbert McNaught (2009). Our findings were surprising: in the Nickle sale there was only a set of small stamp sized die proofs with tiny 1-2mm margins; Sir Gawaine Baillie had a similar set (possibly the same set!); Herb McNaught was unsuccessful in securing any die proofs in black (small or large) of any denomination.
