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

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

The Small Queen Issue has long been one of the most widely collected and studied of all Canadian definitive issues. With a life of over twenty-five years and the resulting varied printings with changes in shade, paper and perforation, the issue is a challenging one to master. Collectors who decide to specialize have their work cut out for them. As an aid to collectors we have prepared an extensive bibliography, which you will find at the back of this catalogue (pages 118-119).

We are indeed pleased to present the Ted Nixon Small Queen Collection. In this special catalogue we have organized the lots by denomination, with proofs, imperforates, plate imprints, stamps and finally covers (in date order) appearing together for each value.

If you previously had the opportunity to study Ted's collection when he was exhibiting, you will have noted that he had an eye for elusive and unusual items. Knowledgeable collectors will appreciate the great rarity of many of the mint singles (such as the 3c perf $12\frac{1}{2}$ and 3c thick soft paper) and plate multiples which are almost never available, in any condition. At least one die proof of each denomi-

nation (including the unissued values) is present. Covers displaying rare rates and exotic destinations abound.

Ted's collection contains numerous items with excellent provenance. Several are from the famous collection of Bill Simpson (ex 1990s Maresch sales unless noted Stanley Gibbons Sale 1980). Many more are illustrated in the excellent reference work that Ted co-authored with John Hillson -- Canada's Postage Stamps of the Small Queen Era 1870-1897, which was published in 2008.

It has been many years since a collection as extensive and well-rounded as this has come to the market. The opportunity to add exciting items to a collection rarely occur. I hope you enjoy the catalogue and good luck with your bids.

LH	Lightly Hinged – with full original gum showing some evidence of a previous hinge.
OG	Original gum – showing some evidence of a previous hinge, a portion of which may still be present.
Part OG	Part original gum.
Unused	Unused without original gum, or regummed.
Ungummed	Without gum as issued.

ESTIMATED VALUES

If an estimated cash value is given, it is shown in the description and always indicated by the abbreviation "Est.". It is used where the lot is large or where the actual value has little relation to the catalogue price. It represents the auctioneer's appraisal of the true CASH value of a lot and the figure is invariably close to the actual realization.
