It is with great pleasure that we bring you part II of the "Libra" Collections. Collectors will find several main areas of interest covered in depth:

## Admiral Issue -- The 10c Plum (Lots 1001-1056)

Specialists will tell you that die proofs of the 10 c plum are hard to come by. They are correct. Even the archives auction of the American Bank Note sale included only one example. Here however, you have no less than seven to choose from. Choice multiples are also offered including extensive plate number pieces. Collectors of marginal lathework will appreciate several rare lots including a block of four and a strip of ten of the rare type B. These we believe to be equally as rare as the better known 10c Bistre. A selection of covers completes this section.

## Admiral Issue - Other values (Lots 1057-1099)

Although the 10 c plum was the owner's main focus, occasionally another value would be added. Of special note are a number of scarce covers including several from the collection of Bob Bayes.

## Government Official Postal Markings (Lots 1100-1243)

If you collect this fascinating field I think you will agree that the collection is likely the finest ever formed. This is your chance to acquire rare and unique items that have been unavailable to collectors for decades.
An under-appreciated area of Canadian philately, it is certainly one that has much opportunity for further study and research.

## King Edward VII Issue (Lots 1244-1282)

This section is primarily postal history related. Illustrated covers, rates, scarce frankings and foreign destinations abound.

## Scroll Issue (Lots 1283-1394)

Again, we feel that this is one of the finest collections ever to come to market. Among the highlights in the more than one hundred lots are three complete sets of die proofs (both with and without imprint), part perforated pairs and blocks, trial colour die proofs, plate multiples, the unique progressive die proof of the famous Bluenose along with the production file, the "man on the mast" plate variety in mint and used blocks and a mint plate block of 45 of the $\$ 1.00$ Parliament. Also on offer are the rare "farmers' booklets" (all three types), the airmails, collection lots and extensive postal history.

## Imperial Economic Conference Issue (Lots 1395-end)

If you have been looking for something new to specialize in perhaps this issue is for you. Although not as widely collected as say the Scroll Issue there is still much of interest. And of course, items such as the set of die proofs are at least as rare.
