As you peruse this catalogue you will no doubt notice that the Jubilee Issue was a great favourite with the consignor. However, you will also find spectacular rarities of the Leaf and Numeral Issues as well. We are thrilled to present Part 3 of this outstanding collection.

Many of these items have not been seen on the market in decades. A few of the many highlights include:

- two complete sets of Jubilee Issue die proofs printed on india paper, previously unavailable and the only examples that we know of

- two additional sets of Jubilee die proofs printed directly on card
- spectacular large used blocks of the $\$ 3, \$ 4$ and $\$ 5$ denominations purchased by the consignor at the Dale-Lichtenstein auction in 1970
- highly unusual trial colour proofs and essays of the Leafs and Numerals
- two very rare complete sets of Leaf Issue large die proofs

The 1897 Diamond Jubilee Issue is an exquisitely designed and engraved set, cherished by collectors the world over. It not only celebrated the 60th year of the reign of Queen Victoria but also ushered in a new era in stamp production and design, paving the way for the Leaf and Numeral Issues that followed. These definitives superseded the Small Queen Issue that had been used for over 25 years.

Originally only a single $3 ¢$ value was planned for the Jubilee Issue, but in May of 1897 the Postmaster General William Mulock announced that a long set of sixteen was to be released. The United States had produced the famed Columbian Issue in 1893 and this no doubt influenced his decision.

Philatelists know the Jubilees not only as the first Canadian commemoratives, but also as the first set supplied to the Dominion by the American Bank Note Company. This firm would go on to produce many Canadian stamps and their relationship with the Canadian Post Office would last several decades. Their archives, which were eventually sold in 1990, supplied collectors with fabulous items never before seen on the marketplace.

I hope you enjoy viewing this impressive collection.

## Background:

Prior to the American Bank Note Company Archives sale in 1990 no complete sets of Jubilee die proofs had ever been offered in the marketplace. A thorough search of past name sale auctions clearly establishes this. Their rarity is further confirmed by the fact that many renowned philatelists were unable to obtain even a single large die proof.

The ABNC Sale therefore, presented a unique opportunity to collectors with vision and foresight. The consignor immediately recognized this and was determined enough to purchase not only six of the ten sets offered in Lots 1661-1670 but also the incredible balance Lot 1660A. This allowed him to put together a further twelve sets. This resulted in a holding that comprised 18 of the 22 known complete sets.

Considering the popularity of this issue, Canada's first ever commemorative set, this is a very low quantity. The Jubilees remain as popular as ever and continues to be collected and studied by a very wide international audience.

## Characteristics:

These proofs are indeed miniature works of art. The die impressions were individually printed on large cards for approval and archival purposes. After approval, the dies were employed to prepare the actual printing plates. Printing orders were subsequently received from the Canadian Post Office, with the finished product then being shipped and distributed to post office counters nationwide.

These die proofs were printed and die sunk directly on finished archival cards measuring approximately $227 \times 150 \mathrm{~mm}$ ( 9 by 6 inches). And importantly, as we shall see later, all sixteen values were printed in the colour of issue.

# 1897 DIAMOND JUBILEE DIE PROOFS PRINTED ON INDIA PAPER

## Background:

The ABNC auction also included Jubilee Issue die proofs printed on die sunk india paper. These are considerably rarer than those printed directly on card. Very little is known about these proofs.

The most obvious distinction between the india sets and those printed on card is that the One cent and Two cent values are printed in reversed colours, the former in green and the latter in orange.

The reason for the reversed colours is unknown. It is interesting to note that the issued colours match those of the Small Queen issue. The reversed colour of the One cent matches the Leaf Issue, released some five months later in December. Perhaps the printer simply reversed the colours by mistake and decided to redo the entire set directly on card due to either lack of india paper stock or time. It is almost certain that the india proofs were printed first.

There may be another reason however. At the same time the Jubilee set was being produced, the UPU Congress was being held in Washington, D.C. Here standardized colours were set for stamps relating to various postal rates. The 5 centimes rate ( 1 cent Canadian) called for a green stamp, but only effective as of January 1, 1899. As the Jubilees were commemoratives, with a maximum expected life of only a few months, there was no reason to change the colours from those already employed for the Small Queen Issue. This set was still being used in 1897. To have the two sets being used concurrently with opposite colours on the One cent and Two cent values would have been confusing for postal clerks and consumers alike. More research may reveal the true answer.

Remarkably enough, no complete set on india was ever assembled. However, the consignor realized that the American Bank Note Company sale presented yet another opportunity. By purchasing the impressive balance lot (Lot 1660) as well as individual One and Two cent proofs in the reversed colours, he successfully assembled two complete sets of the india proofs. These are offered here.

## Characteristics:

There are two distinctive features on proofs printed on india paper that distinguish them from those printed directly on card. First, the One cent is printed in green and the Two cent in orange - the colours are reversed. Second, being printed on india paper and then sunk on card, they display a more opaque tone when held against a light source, as well as a higher luminescence under ultra-violet light. The latter trait is especially apparent, the india paper exhibits considerable fluorescence. Those printed directly on card show none of these features.

## Background:

After the printing contract with the British American Banknote Company expired on April 22, 1897, a new contract was awarded to American Bank Note a month later. Soon after design work began on both the 1897 Jubilee issue and the new definitive set now commonly known as the Maple Leaf issue.

It is important to note that the 5th UPU Postal Congress was held during May-June 1897 in Washington, USA, for the purpose of revising but also for establishing changes in colours for certain denominations of stamps. The purpose of this was to help postal staffs to easily identify specific postal rates worldwide. For example, green for the 1 cent ( 5 centimes) printed matter rate, blue for the 5 cent ( 25 centimes) UPU letter rate addressed to a foreign country, etc. This clearly signaled a new era for standardization and uniformity of postal rates among countries, further helping to solidify trade and communication.

The American Bank Note Company Archives sale in 1990 only offered two full sets of die proofs of the Leaf issue (Lot 1804 and 1805) plus a balance lot (Lot 1806) containing three others. Prior to the sale, we believe that no other existed. There was one nearly complete set however, in the famous Dr. Lewis Reford collection. His holdings were dispersed in a series of five sales in 1950-1951; lot 771 (Part 1) had seven leaf proofs but the Half cent was missing. The Reford set was offered four years later in the Alfred Lichtenstein collection of Canada from 1897 on (sale date November 1-2, 1954), individually offered as seven Lots 36-42, still missing the Half cent.

The Maple Leaf definitive set of eight die proofs in issued colours is therefore remarkably rare, with only five complete sets known, a very small number indeed. In our opinion, they are truly undervalued and under-appreciated, especially considering their important role in the changes of postal matters during the late XIX century within Canada boundaries and beyond.

If the opinion of a mutually acceptable authority is desired, this period will be extended as noted in Condition 8. All disputed lots must be returned intact in the condition received. Photographed lots are not returnable on account of centering or perforations. Lots containing more than twenty stamps, described "as is", or described as having faults are not returnable for any reason. Bidders who have had an opportunity to examine the lots prior to the sale may not return the lots.
(b) AUTHENTICITY. Any lot, which is declared other than genuine by a mutually acceptable authority is returnable, provided the lot is received within a period of four weeks from the date of the auction. Proof that a "mutually acceptable authority" declines to express an opinion is not normally grounds for the return of a lot.
(c) Returns must be made by registered mail.
(d) Lots marked or encapsulated by an expert committee are not returnable for any reason.
(e) Lots accompanied by an existing certificate are not returnable.

## EXTENSION OF TIME

8. When an opinion from an acceptable authority is necessary, the buyer shall:
(f) Submit the lot without delay to either; (1) the Vincent Graves Greene Foundation or Sergio Sismondo for Canada and British North America; (2) Sergio Sismondo, British Philatelic Association or the Royal Philatelic Society of London for British Commonwealth; (3) Sergio Sismondo for Foreign and (4) PF (Philatelic Foundation) for United States.
(g) Ensure that advice in writing to this effect be received before the auction.
(h) Remit in full for the lot. The buyer shall be reimbursed in full for any lot declared other than genuine.

## EXPENSES OF CERTIFICATION

9. Expenses shall be borne by the buyer except where the lot is other than as described and is returned within the conditions set forth above. Our responsibility is expressly limited to:
(a) The actual cost of the opinion if up to $\$ 30.00$ or less, or
(b) The cost of the opinion up to $5 \%$ of the sale price but not exceeding a maximum of $\$ 100.00$.
(c) We are not responsible for expenses on the return of any lot.

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10. Canadian residents will be charged GST or HST as appropriate for their mailing address. Foreign residents are liable for GST only on the buyer's premium.

Hinging on mint stamps is always disclosed, however, never hinged status should not be expected unless specifically stated "never hinged" or "NH".

## ESTIMATED VALUES

If an estimated cash value is given, it is shown in the description and always indicated by the abbreviation "Est.". It is used where the lot is large or where the actual value has little relation to the catalogue price. It represents the auctioneer's appraisal of the true CASH value of a lot and the figure is invariably close to the actual realization. It is useless for mail bidders to list any bids that are only a low proportion of such estimates.
