An interesting observation - above the seventh stamp of top row, there is a clear albino embossed stamp which appears to be a stamping die of British Columbia bearing the words INLAND REVENUE "Arms" in outer circle with heraldic arms within. It occurred only once on the unique sheet of 240 stamps (bought by K. Bileski at the Lichtenstein sale in 1956 and broken up) from which this multiple originates.

No attempt has been made by Unitrade to list a NH premium for this stamp. Catalogue value only reflects the sum of mint OG singles - also no premium was given for the large multiple.

According to Wellburn, the foremost expert and collector of British Columbia \& Vancouver Island, only 30 imperforate sheets of each of the 5 c rose and 10 c blue were included in the sole shipment of Vancouver Island stamps from De La Rue in London. These were simultaneously issued in the Colony with regular perforated stamps.

Only a very small number of Five cent imperforate mint with original gum exist in sound condition. During our research we were able to locate a mint pair (ex. Dale-Lichtenstein) and a mint single (ex. Ferrary, Burrus, Amundsen, Samos, Baillie) which last sold in 2006 for US $\$ 86,250$ inclusive of buyer's premium. The other examples, very few in number, are of noticeably inferior quality.

It is interesting to note that this Progressive Die Proof (in any colour) was absent in both the DaleLichtenstein and Gerald Wellburn collections.

Originally employed for the British Columbia Mainland Colony as a 3 pence stamp issued in 1865, this versatile design was reintroduced a few years later by De La Rue \& Co. In January 1866 decimal currency was adopted. To comply with this change and the fact that Vancouver Island and British Columbia Mainland were being united as one Colony, De La Rue was instructed to expedite new issues. The fastest, most economical and efficient method to proceed was to reintroduce the existing 3 pence die, printing sheets in different colours surcharged with the requested denominations, from "TWO CENTS" to "1 DOLLAR 1".

Although Nova Scotia issued a one penny stamp in 1853, there was no comparable value in New Brunswick. A popular theory is that a one penny rate for printed matter was current (Nova Scotia had reduced their printed circular rate from 2 pence to 1 penny in 1856). As no New Brunswick penny stamp was issued, a 3 pence stamp was bisected to pay this rate. This is the ONLY KNOWN COVER BEARING A SINGLE USAGE OF THE BISECTED THREE PENCE STAMP.

(2) double letter rate to USA (one of which resides in the Royal Collection).

## THE PERKINS BACON "CANCELLED" STAMPS

In August 1861, Perkins Bacon provided six or fewer copies of each denomination to Ormond Hill, the nephew of Sir Rowland Hill, for members of the family. The stamps were obliterated with a barred oval handstamp overprint "CANCELLED". According to the detailed research and illustrated census compiled by Peter Jaffe* (see reference below), the following values related to Newfoundland have been seen and reported by the author. The first figure is the number currently known, while the second figure is the number of other examples that may possibly exist:

1860 1sh orange $(2 ; 0)$
3 p green $(3 ; 1)$
4p orange ( $2 ; 0$ )
5 p red brown $(3 ; 3)$ - updated census

1861-1862 4 p rose $(1 ; 3)$

A total of 19 examples overprinted "CANCELLED" have been reported so far. It is interesting to note that four examples, including a 5 p red brown, 1 sh orange, 6 p rose and $61 / 2 \mathrm{p}$ rose permanently reside in The Royal Collection, leaving a mere 15 stamps available to the public.

This is just a souvenir which may be of great value some day as it goes by Aeroplane "Raymor", the first machine to attempt to cross the Atlantic - have told dear old Morgan to look you up when he gets time: he'll be a tremendous Lion if he does it. Goodbye dearest mine Yours G. April 19 1919"

According to recent published articles and handbooks, the quantity of stamps bearing this manuscript is still unknown. It has been reported that W.D. Campbell, Secretary to the Post Office once announced "some 50 stamps were so inscribed." Today however, fewer than twenty covers are known.

The Martinsyde "Raymor" got off the ground before the successful Alcock-Brown Vickers flight but soon failed (along with similar fate to its two other attempts - on May 18 and July 17). Resulted in wrecking the airplane shortly after take off, but without any casualties. Shortly after the first attempt, Major Morgan returned to England for medical reasons. After the third attempt, Major Raynham had personally hand carried the mailbag with him upon his return to England; only to be delivered months later to the British postal authorities on January 7 where all known Martynside covers were backstamped with the London F.S. 667 JA 20 double ring datestamp.

It has been well documented that a single order of 51,000 stamps was placed in May 1851 with the printer Messrs. Rawdon, Wright, Hatch and Edson. The stamps were delivered to the postal authorities the same month and issued to the public on June 14, with 1,510 stamps being distributed among fourteen post offices (reference: Howes, Clifton "Canada Its Postage Stamps and Postal History", 1911, page 37). Only 1,450 examples were sold over a span of nearly 6 years. Those unsold were sent back and destroyed together with the unissued remainder (a total of 49,490 stamps) during May 1857. It was clear from the beginning that demand would be very limited indeed. The only logical uses for the stamp were to prepay the quadruple domestic rate, the double letter rate to the United States and the single letter rate for bimonthly mails from Montreal via Boston to Newfoundland, Bermuda or the British West Indies.
